

## Brown City Youth Camp Rules

1. All youth ages 12-18 years (completed 6<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grade), must register in the Youth Office on the day of arrival, regardless of their length of stay.
2. The Camp Director's word is the final authority, or the Assistant Director's in the absence of the Camp Director.
3. Be present and on time at morning chapel, small groups, and evening services.
4. You must always wear your wristband. It is your pass to attend the services and to participate in the activities and sports. Without your wristband on, you are not allowed to participate. Replacements are available at the youth office.
5. You must remain on the campgrounds at all times, unless you have **SIGNED** permission from the youth office. **Only those adults included on the registration form are allowed to take youth off of the campgrounds.**
6. Be in your dorm or at your camp lot at 10:45pm.
7. All campers and staff are to respect the rights of others.
8. There is a \$100 fine for setting off Fire Alarms or discharging extinguishers for reasons other than a fire. A fine of \$100 will be assessed to an individual caught defacing camp property. Campers are not allowed to climb rafters in the dorms. Violation of these rules could result in work duties and/or expulsion from camp.
9. Christian behavior is always expected in areas of attitude, language, and dating. For this reason, we expect no public display of affection between any individuals. This especially pertains to our meetings in the tabernacles. Our focus is to be on God during corporate worship and not on one another.
10. Please be advised that any misbehavior will be taken very seriously. The camp has instituted a Discipline Committee to handle adult and youth rule infractions. They keep careful records and are very thorough. In light of this, please do not make the mistake of thinking that there are no consequences for misdeeds at the end of camp. Records are kept right up to the last hours of camp. For this reason, you can be certain that misbehavior on the way out of camp will have definite consequences, one of which may be the inability to return to camp the next year and/or the inability to participate in other Regional functions. If behavior is unlawful, the local law enforcement agency will be contacted.
11. Absolutely no guys in the girls' dorms and no girls in the guys' dorm. Lot campers are not allowed to be in the dorms at any time.
12. The following items are not permitted at camp: alcohol, tobacco, e-cigarettes, marijuana, illegal drugs, fireworks, knives, guns or other dangerous implements.
13. Youth, age 18 and under, may not be on a camp lot without an adult of at least age 21 being present on the same or adjacent lot and claiming responsibility for them.
14. Modesty of dress is expected. Shoes and shirts must be worn at all times. No miniskirts, halter tops, midriff exposure or spaghetti strap tank tops are allowed. Sleeveless undershirts, known as wife beaters, must not be worn as outerwear. Proper underclothing must be worn at all times. All underwear must be just that – "under", not visible. Shorts must be moderate in length. T-shirts with inappropriate logos and/or sayings are unacceptable on the campus. Directors, deans, counselors, and other staff have the right to require teens to change clothing which is questionable.
15. The use of vehicles, motorized scooters, golf carts, or bicycles is limited to those age 18 or older and not registered in the youth program.
16. Youth, age 18 and under, who are not staying in the dorms are required to observe the same rules as those who stay in the dorms.

17. Dorm campers: All medication must be turned in to the camp health director in the **original container** upon arrival. The health director will distribute the medication at the appropriate times.
18. Youth are to abide by the "Our Life Together Agreement" in the Brown City Camp Brochure, set forth by the camp board.
19. Please respect what has been given to us. **Do not write on pews or damage the dorms or bathrooms.** You will be held responsible for any damages.
20. In the past we have asked campers not to bring cell phones, iPods, etc however we are now asking that you police yourself. All music and media should be appropriate and pleasing to God. Inappropriate use of any electronic devices during scheduled services will result in the item being taken from you and returned at the end of camp. **BCC is not responsible for lost, misplaced or stolen items or cash.**

The registration form must be signed by the camper and a parent/guardian signifying that these guidelines have been read by both parties. By signing the form you are agreeing to abide by the camp guidelines. Failure to abide by these guidelines can lead to dismissal from Brown City Camp and the camper will be sent home at their own expense.
